# **Business Loop I-196 Meeting**



## I-196 Business Loop (BL) Rebuilding US-31 in Holland to 88th Avenue in Zeeland

#### **Ottawa County**

April - November 2024

#### What Is Being Done?

The Michigan Department of Transportation (MDOT) is investing approximately \$17 million to rebuild 4.5 miles of eastbound and westbound I-196 Business Loop (BL) from US-31 in Holland to 88th Avenue in Zeeland. Work includes asphalt resurfacing, full-depth concrete joint repairs, new signs, traffic signal work, crosswalk safety improvements, and new guardrail.

#### Safety Benefit

This project will improve the ride and is a long-term investment for the service life of the corridor.

#### How Will Traffic Be Affected?

Eastbound I-196 BL will be closed and detoured from April to August, and then westbound I-196 BL will close from August to November. Traffic will be detoured to 16th Street/Adams Street. Short-term closures will be in effect on side streets during intersection reconstruction. Access to businesses will be maintained at all times.

#### When Will This Be Done?

Work begins in April and is expected to be finished in late November 2024.

On **March 26, 2024, from 4:00 p.m. - 5:30 p.m.**, the Michigan Department of Transportation (MDOT) will be holding a public meeting for the upcoming construction on Business Loop I-196. The meeting will be an open house format, and will take place in the North Activity Room of the Howard Miller Public Library in Zeeland. MDOT will be working on the entirety of the Business Loop this year, with a full reconstruction between US-31 and Paw Paw Drive, and joint repairs between Paw Paw Drive and 88th Avenue.

At its meeting on February 26, the MACC Policy Board approved the 2050 Long-Range Transportation Plan (LRTP). After its Policy Board approval, the document now goes to the respective state and federal authorities for final approval. The LRTP is a strategic document that outlines

transportation goals, policies, and projects for a region typically spanning at least 20 years into the future. It serves as a blueprint for transportation infrastructure development, addressing various modes of transportation such as roads, highways, public transit, biking, and walking paths. The 2050 LRTP was developed by MACC staff in collaboration with federal, state, and local partners, as well as stakeholders and the public. The plan considers factors like population growth, economic development, environmental impact, and emerging technologies to create a comprehensive vision for the region's transportation system. The Non-Motorized Planning Committee (NMPC) is a specialized group within transportation planning that focuses on infrastructure and policies related to pedestrian and cyclist mobility. Its primary objective is to promote and

enhance walking and biking as viable modes of transportation within our community. The committee's efforts contribute to creating a more sustainable, healthy, and inclusive community by prioritizing non-motorized modes of transportation alongside traditional motorized options. Our next meeting will be March 13, 2024 at 11:00 a.m. at the MACC Offices. We will be discussing a path rating system and other exciting topics.
