
Green Commute Week Results



Green Commute Week was a resounding success this year, taking place from September 10 to September 16. Our promotion efforts spanned various platforms, including Nextdoor, Facebook, our website, WHTC radio, the Holland Sentinel newspaper, and eye-catching yard signs strategically placed at over 40 prominent locations throughout the MACC region. The response was remarkable, with over 200 enthusiastic participants joining in this year's Green Commute Week. Together, they collectively logged an impressive 2,153 "green commute" miles. These miles were achieved through diverse eco-friendly modes of transportation such as cycling, walking, running, utilizing public transit, carpooling, and other alternatives to conventional driving. Notably, these green commute miles translated into a reduction of 1,658 pounds of carbon dioxide emissions, contributing to a cleaner and more sustainable environment. To celebrate this achievement, on September 18, we had the pleasure of randomly selecting 11 lucky winners who each received a \$50 gift card, redeemable at either Meijer or one of the five outstanding local bicycle

AMPO Cleveland Conference

The conference drew over 500 attendees from all corners of the country, making it an ideal platform for networking and staying informed about the latest trends in urban planning, grant opportunities, and technical insights. The conference covered a wide range of topics, from pressing issues such as climate and resiliency to the practical aspects of designing complete streets and fostering citizen engagement. Looking ahead, the 2024 Conference is set to take place in Salt Lake City, Utah, and the MACC is already making plans to send a representative to this exciting event.

Federal Grant Application

On September 28th, the MACC took a significant step by submitting a grant application to the United States Department of Transportation under the Reconnecting Communities and Neighborhoods (RCN) funding opportunity. In this endeavor, the MACC is actively seeking **\$5.8 million** in federal funds. This substantial financial support is earmarked for the construction of a vital non-motorized bridge spanning Business Loop I-196 in Zeeland. Additionally, these funds will be directed towards the development of a comprehensive network of multi-use pathways,

seamlessly connecting the proposed bridge to the existing multi-use path infrastructure in the region. Furthermore, the MACC has demonstrated its commitment to enhancing safety in the greater Holland/Zeeland area. In July 2023, the organization submitted another crucial grant application under the Safe Streets and Roads for All (SS4A) funding opportunity, with a request for \$240,000. We anticipate to hear back about the SS4A grant this month, and the RCN grant early next year. This funding is designated for the development of a regional Safety Action Plan, a pivotal prerequisite for future construction projects eligible under this funding program. It's important to note that this funding opportunity remains valid for the next three years. These grant applications represent our collective efforts to secure the necessary resources to make the greater Holland/Zeeland area safer and more accessible for all residents. Your support and continued collaboration are instrumental in achieving these essential community goals.
