IV. TRANSPORTATION PROGRAM

A. FY 2023-2026 TIP Amendment - Mr. Miller presented a TIP amendment, which involves a year change for a bridge replacement project. Mr. Latham noted that the recent Technical Advisory Committee (TAC) did not have a quorum for this item, but it was discussed. It needs Board approval as it involves moving a project from the previous 2020-2023 TIP to the current 2023-2026 TIP.

B. MDOT/FHWA Comments – Mr. Kent shared that the project on US 31 is wrapping up by mid-November. Mr. Latham shared that an FHWA representative is planning to attend the TAC and/or Policy meetings on a quarterly basis.

V. ADMINISTRATIVE ISSUES

A. Financial Report – Mr. Latham shared that MACC finances look good. Some additions/changes will be made as some outstanding FY2022 data comes in.

- B. MACC Executive Committee Report Mr. Latham shared that the BL-196 crossing study contract has been signed. Once all the data needed is gathered, the stakeholder process will start. The first Clean Air Action billboard will go up next month: "This holiday season, pass the sides, and share the rides". More billboards will go up throughout the coming year. A draft Value Report was reviewed by the Executive Committee. MACC plans to prepare similar reports for all member cities/townships, and have them delivered by the end of this year. Feedback will be appreciated. MDOT contract authorizations are coming in. Unexpected additional moneys may be coming in from MDOT, which will have to be spent in FY2023.

Re: FY 2023 Allocation Carryover Funding

The MACC recently received **\$1,028,798** (\$1,002,774 STP & \$26,024 STP Flex) in Allocation Carryover from MDOT. However, our Carbon Reduction amount went down, so we had to subtract \$1,817 from a project. These funds must be allocated in FY23.

At the 11/7/22 TAC Meeting the funds were agreed to be split as followed:

OCRC – 64th Avenue JN: 206128 - **\$144,798**

OCRC – 8th Street/Chicago Drive

JN: 206145 - **\$460,000**

ACRC – 136th Avenue JN: 206323 - **\$224,000**

HcT – Greenly Street

JN: 206345 - \$100,000 (SUBTRACT \$1,817 FROM CARBON REDUCTION)

Laketown Twp. - Blue Star Highway

JN: 206346 - **\$100,000**

- Jason gave a brief update on the audit that is scheduled for the week of Thanksgiving. We anticipate that it should run smoothly and Jason is looking forward to the process.
- MDOT has made additional federal aid available. The MACC will be getting
 just over \$1 million in FY23 funding. Alec and Jason have been working with
 MDOT to determine what "strings" are attached to the funding. Alec has
 prepared a significant amount of information for the November TAC meeting,
 with at least 3 scenarios as a starting point for how the funding could be
 distributed. Anticipate several TIP amendments at the November Policy
 meeting.
- Jason met with BHS Insurance last week and went over the MACC's liability coverage. Jason recommended increasing the general liability coverage from \$1 Million to \$2 Million. The MACC was able to retain Cyber Liability Insurance! BHS was worried that the Cyber Liability underwriters would not offer the coverage, as they have been canceling the majority cyber coverage. (2022 cyber coverage was \$1,309, 2023 will be \$1,511)
- The group discussed the upcoming meeting with Rep. Slagh and are optimistic that he will be able to find additional funding for the I-196BL project.
